## Parable of the Lost Sheep

A teacher instructed her students to rewrite Jesus' Parable of the Lost Sheep, putting it in a modern setting. One student wrote:

When you find it, you are so happy that you take the other 99 sheets, throw them into the air and say, 'Yippee! I have found my lost sheet.'"


The latest edition of Word for Today has arrived. You can pick up a copy from the hall or if you would like me to post you a copy, I am very happy to do so.
