Confession

A duke once boarded a galley ship and went below to talk to the convicts manning the oars. When he asked several of them what their crimes were, almost every man claimed to be innocent, blaming someone else, or even accused the judge of taking a bribe.

There was one young man whose reply was different. He said, 'I deserve to be here, sir. I stole some money. No one is at fault but me. I am guilty.'
